Truthfully, it has always been difficult not naming the vast majority of the top women for three consecutive editions of this magazine, but that's just how crowded it is at the top of this industry in the appropriately-named "Prime Era".

Jade set the standard for women's wrestling in this brand new era with her dominant title reign during the first season, but the moment that she was lost to Alexa Bliss at Starrcade, I had a gut feeling that major changes were coming for this determined and incredibly talented young woman!

I am not going to relitigate the year she has had, but very few people in this business can be credited with changing the game, and that is precisely what Jade has done. Her time is absolutely coming soon to stand atop AEW, but for reasons we will get into later, it isn't coming yet.

#### SEVEN. Sasha Banks

Speaking of women who are changing the game, Sasha Banks is back on top of women's wrestling, and she is exploiting every damn second of it! While Toni Storm dominates AEW's Knockouts, and WWE gives us three leading women, Sasha Banks stands as a quasi-self-proclaimed "Undisputed Champion", as the only singles world champion of any sort in ULW.

More confident than ever with Chyna loyally by her side, Sasha aspires to mold the division in her image, obnoxiously reminding everyone that she calls herself "the Boss", and insisting that the rest of the locker room is not worthy of sharing a ring with her.

Of course, hours after this magazine is published, Sasha is set to defend her prize against a rejuvenated Paige, but time will tell if the young Brit will be able to topple the reigning champion!

#### SIX. Granddaddy Duxen

November 2025 will forever be associated with a transformational moment in the lengthy career of Granddaddy Duxen. From lovable legend to bitter old man, this relic of the past is now obsessed with the idea of proving that he is more than the laughs that he has given us over the years.

Instead, Duxen wants the rest of the industry to both respect his contributions as well as fear what comes next at his hands. On top of that, Duxen flatly rejected a challenge offered by his former protégé, Ladies Man. Ladies Man wants to get vengeance for Duxen's betrayal of him, but for now Duxen refuses to oblige.

In the immediate future, Duxen is soon set to participate in his own tournament qualification match. Will Ladies Man try to play a factor there? Can Duxen get back to the top? It is safe to say that the world is eager to find out!

#### FIVE. Toni Storm

No single talent in this business is better at getting the people's attention than Toni Storm. Once again, I am forced by reality to put the AEW Knockout's Champion in this list as she insists upon shining through the crowd and asserting herself as a key playmaker in this industry!

If BWM Inc. does the unthinkable in becoming the only company to dominate two eras (and, let's face it, that's the question at the crux of our current era), Toni Storm will be a big reason why that becomes the case. No, I am not saying that the race to the top is already over. Far from it!

Instead, what I am saying is that Toni Storm is to the Seventh Era what Splinter was to the first, what Blaster was to the second, what Dragonfly and Metalhead were to the third, an so on: she is a main attraction, and may in and of herself represent a paradigm shift in human or humanoid form!

#### FOUR. Brock Lesnar

In the wake of his momentous victory over Slammu and subsequent solidified entry into the ULW Undisputed Championship tournament, Brock Lesnar stands ready to lead the industry well into the future! However, the Beast Incarnate has his work cut out for him, as he is far from the only star – or even monster, for that matter – who has their sights set on claiming the top of the mountain!

With one eye aimed at the tournament in question and another eye looking forward to next year's Starrcade, Lesnar is trying to take on the world en route to his dreams of ruling the roost. The question remains: can he pull it off?

Brock's two-decade-long career is a cautionary tale of massive hype and little follow-through. Remember that he first debuted in the UWA-Northern Division, only to be drafted later on to the Southern Division where he ambitions were stomped out from misstep after misstep from being eliminated by Dragonfly from UWA-SD's tournament to crown the inaugural UWA Heavyweight Champion to his embarrassing rivalry with the Crock, then through his being trapped in the tag division by Nathan Jones's side until he reinvented himself in MMA.

His story has brought him back to the world title picture for a very brief reign in PWI, and nothing since. Is this the moment Brock has been waiting for? We shall see.

#### THREE. Sami Zayn

From the former "Next Big Thing" to someone who still ostensibly runs things in AEW...well, sort of, we have to direct our attention to Sami Zayn!

Yes, I am sure that you are looking all puzzled at your screen here, but I assure you that this guy has earned every bit of being the number three overall best talent in the industry right now. Now, with Megan having betrayed him alongside Benny in order to join with Uncle Howdy, I can't help but anticipate that Sami is one of the few who can realistically expect to come knocking on number one's door in the near future!

#### TWO. Will Ospreay

This brings me to the newly-crowned AEW World Champion: Will Ospreay! Ospreay had to grow on a number of us since last year, but I believe wholeheartedly that he has more than earned this spot. In fact, in any other reality, Will would be the undisputed number one pick, but the adventure is far from over.

Truthfully, I can see Will making a serious play for the top spot in one month when we revisit this list, but it depends on how his reign goes. If he starts to become formulaic – and yes, it is possible for awesome stars such as Ospreay to slip into such -, then he could lose favor with the audience and his stock could subsequently drop in my eyes. Yet, if he can maintain his current trajectory, he could join Toni and a few others as a sincere staple of this era; a pillar, if you will.

This journey is still in its infancy, though, and plenty of good and bad booking can either boost his image or sully it when all is said and done. The unknown is what makes compiling this list so fun. I am a little giddy wondering who will pop up next!

#### ONE. The Rock/Seth Rollins

Last, but far from least, is the top slot, and I feel that I have no choice but to place Seth Rollins and The Rock in this spot, together!



Sean Olson versus Brandon Lee: THE Blood Feud of our Time

It's a story as old as time, the war of siblings as they battle it out to see who the master of the house is! Perhaps no story of sibling rivalry outside of the Mouse Family has had the staying power of Brandon Lee and Sean Olson!

Olson and Lee stole the show with their incredible athleticism, and they only further sealed the deal of their incredible abilities in the ring and in the air when they joined the HCW/BFCW invasion of USWA that fall, triggering the Allegiance War.

Back then, there were a lot of high flyers, but not too many were like Olson and Lee, and when the team managed to come back to the mainstream as Temporary Contracted stars from HCW joining the ranks of UWA, I was not surprised when they became the first tag team champions of the Southern Division!

Then, came the egos of Olson and Lee, and those egoes were bound to clash in a way that destroyed their unity. A lot of people don't remember this, but Olson wasn't always the undisputed breakout star of the two of them.

No, in the beginning, their stars shined equally as bright. So, heading into their first bout in the mainstream at Abominable Actions in the inaugural Aerial Assault Match, Lee was seen as just as big as his brother Sean!

The fans and the betting odds were evenly split, in most respects. Olson may have been a tad faster and more adept at aerial moves, but Lee was swift, and decent in the air, while having the added factor of being more clever. After all, the man was seen in a more prominent light in UWA after Abominable Actions, leading to his milestone participation in the Inaugural Total Anarchy Match at Motivation 2!

Olson, though, became better at backstage politicking over time, and Lee found himself get left behind as Olson was shot into the stratosphere after adding LWF to his temporary contract and rising to the top by the end of July in 2004! From that point, onward, Olson was seen as the golden goose of the business!

LWF had reinvented Sean Olson to go from being equal to Brandon Lee to Lee's superior on the big stage. Yes, Lee rose to the top in UWA in the 4<sup>th</sup> Era, but by then, the UWA had slipped into being the number 3 company behind EWA (where Olson was) and HCW.

Lee and Olson crossed paths again in PWI during the 5<sup>th</sup> Era, and they wound up ending that era as PWI's last tag champions until the 6<sup>th</sup> Era. Following that, the two got split up again, and they really hadn't had too many major encounters since.

As a result, the rivalry was kind of forgotten until AEW got their hands on both of them for the first time this past summer during Lee's title reign. With Olson back in BWM Inc., he spoiled Lee's moment and stole his manager following a brutal victory which purportedly marked the end of Lee, for good!

But, Lee is done with people forgetting him, and he bounced back to take down his brother with the bloated ego! Costing Olson his own world title reign became the perfect vengeance for Lee en route to an incredible resurrection of the best damn story going on the AEW, in my book.

With another encounter up and coming, the people need to brace themselves for something special. I trust that Olson's recent push was not for naught, but neither was the return of Brandon Lee.



### Historic Spotlight (Highlight of a Moment at this point in wrestling history)

November 8<sup>th</sup>, 2008: WOW Diplomatic Deficiency The Forgotten WOW Super Event By Johnny Quest

Six months after the mammothly-successful "From Dusk Til Dawn", which kicked off the Fourth Era, EWA, UWA, and HCW started negotiating with the WOW to arrange another mid-point joint extravaganza. There was even talk about making this a regular thing every year, but things didn't exactly pan out the way everyone envisioned.

Talks for this second WOW show of the era started in mid-September 2008, just three months into what was then a brand new era. HCW and EWA were trading wins, and UWA had yet to earn a second ratings victory after the blockbuster premiere called "The Second Coming". So, it was clearly a surprise war between EWA and Brown's HCW.

All three promotions saw this show as being a great way to showcase what the stories were across the board while spring-boarding into the Winter season. Moreover, there was an award show that has since been forgotten!

Yes, that's correct, the last WOW Awards before Starrcade 2024 wasn't the 2005 awards, but rather the 2008 WOW Awards showcased at "Diplomatic Deficiency"!

I know, I know. It's a forgettable name, one which was proposed by Mickey, and it was actually agreed upon by Brown and Benny.

Was it because they felt bad about kicking Mickey's ass in the ratings? No, it definitely was not that. Was it a result of Benny already developing dementia? Nah, it wasn't that bad yet. Rather, it was a lack of real devotion to any real theme for the show.

The card was tragically forgettable outside of the HCW, EWA, UWA, and WOW awards that were mysteriously presented just six months in to the brand new era.

There were a few major developments, though, and these developments have stood the test of time as the only real things remembered about the show:

Firstly, the challenge for a "respectable" rematch between Slammu and Splinter was proposed at this show, and it happened during the WOW award ceremony. We were also teased the first ever singles encounter between Dragonfly and Metalhead. Both of these bouts were slated for the second From Dusk Til Dawn (which was supposed to take place in the spring of 2009, but got postponed until that September due to the collapse of EWA and the rebirth of ECW).

The biggest moment, though, was something no one will ever forget, and it is connected with what remains the longest-running story of all time: the Mouse Saga!

You see, heading into this extravaganza, EWA started reaching out to UWA and HCW separately to negotiate trades for talent. The deal struck between UWA and EWA is lost to memory, because it obviously didn't make too much of a splash (though, I am sure that it somehow involved the Harlem Turtles being traded to EWA, where they picked up the tag titles for their first reign under the BWM Inc. banner), but the biggest deal – perhaps of the era – was a trade of Teo and Attitude to EWA in exchange for Rhyno heading to HCW.

EWA desperately did not want HCW to have a payoff of the Teo and Attitude, which had a history going back to immediately preceding the dawn of the Third Era and UWF. HCW had been delivering a show-stealing program building to what was supposed to be their first ever one on one encounter. BWM Inc. saw the potential massive ratings draw that this promised (in addition to being determined to finish this feud themselves, after they started it). So, they offered John Brown a deal he couldn't refuse: the return of Rhyno!

Rhyno was the pride and joy of HCW, and that was the case going all the way back to the Second Era with the dawn of the company under a new name in its rebirth breaking free from the tyrannical developmental grip it had been serving under as WWWF.

Rhyno had played a pivotal role in helping the Allegiance battle USWA in the War, and then he quickly rose to the top as the premier HCW Temporary contracted star in UWA during the Third Era, nabbing three UWA World Titles along the way!

Then, at the outset of the Fourth Era, in the immediate aftermath of "From Dusk Til Dawn", EWA shockingly drafted Rhyno, and had since been subjecting him to humiliation in the early months of this brand new era.

John Brown had always been irritated with the way EWA was mocking Rhyno week in and week out. So, yes, he accepted the deal. What he didn't realize, though, was how Benny would send Rhyno back to HCW!

In the build to Diplomatic Deficiency, a scandal had broke in EWA's stories, seeing Benny unveiled to have been cheating on his wife Molly with the then-pregnant Jane Mouse (the only woman who will ever be able to stake claim to having lain with all four Mouse brothers, eck...)!

Meanwhile, Benny's abuse of Rhyno had built up some tension between boss and employee, and Rhyno was set to confront Benny at the show.

Well, as a last-ditch effort to "bury" Rhyno before sending HCW their top-babyface, Benny dodged a Gore by Rhyno, causing Rhyno to smash right into Jane and cause a violent miscarriage!

Benny then promptly "fired" Rhyno for his actions, and that was all she wrote for Rhyno's time with EWA in the Fourth Era.

Reportedly, behind the scenes, Brown was outraged that Benny had done this, as it obviously tainted the man who was supposed to positively represent his company going forward!

Here's the thing: this twist actually MASSIVELY backfired on Benny and EWA in the end. As I noted before, EWA and HCW were in the midst of a ratings slugfest. While this moment set Brown back on one set of plans, what came next was a nightmare for Benny and his designs on conquering the business once and for all.

A few months prior, HCW had decided to capitalize on their acquisition of Scott Nash in the Draft by portraying him as an invader on behalf of Mickey, sent to resurrect the NWO and bring down HCW as retribution for turning their backs on Mickey. The acquisition of Rhyno paved the way for Rhyno to return to HCW, acting as if he was going to stand

beside Ted Brown in defense of the company, but instead, Rhyno capitalized on the heat he had obtained by causing a miscarriage as he betrayed HCW and joined Nash's side!

What followed then was pure ratings dominance by HCW throughout most of the rest of the era. This dominance only seemed to mellow out a little by the end of the spring when UWA finally found its footing. However, EWA never really recovered from the shock of HCW springing to the top.

If anything, you may well be able to draw a straight line from this fateful night to the demise of EWA, resurrection of ECW, and the ascension of what we call the "HCW Era" (the Fourth Era's nickname, but it also shares a name with the previous HCW Era which came about as HCW was left as the only company standing in 2005 through 2007).

Where would we be if it wasn't for the one and only "Diplomatic Deficiency"? The forgotten WOW extravaganza!

Is WIN a threat? Analyzing the latest vision of Industry Pioneer, Jeff Murrey

On January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2026, Jeff Murrey plans to launch what he calls the "Wrestling International Network".

Reportedly, Murrey plans to include content from every wrestling promotion he has had his hands on throughout his long involvement in this industry!

On the surface, this appears to be yet another outward expression of Murrey's delusions of grandeur complete with bravado and lofty promises. We don't know how Murrey plans on retrieving content and records that were believed to be long lost to wrestling history, but this – I felt, at least – deserved to be acknowledged for what it is.

You see, Murrey has always had his suspicions about the World of Wrestling, even going back to the first WOW-sponsored event: "Epicenter of Mayhem", in December 2003, followed by the inaugural WOW Awards that following week.

While Murrey was honored with a lifetime achievement award for helping bring the business to the mainstream in the early 1990s, Murrey used the opportunity during his acceptance speech to defiantly proclaim that he was launching what he truly believed would be the "Last Wrestling Federation".

Murrey felt at the time that it was time for the industry to come to a conclusion, with him back on top of the world, and for the first nine weeks of its existence, it really felt like LWF was unstoppable, and that it would actually bring the industry to heel.

But, fate had other plans, and LWF closed shop by the end of that summer with Murrey scurrying over to UWA after LWF's board ousted him in favor of Bischoff. At that point, aside from his brief partnership with Mickey in late-2004 and early-2005, launching the short-lived WWO, Murrey remained silent or even subordinate under Mickey in Mmouse Enterprises.

Of course, he did find himself back in the spotlight again, when the leadership chaos in Mmouse Enterprises forced the Board of Directors to ask Murrey to lead the company at the outset of the Sixth Era. Under his leadership, PWI gradually became a steady ship, but his leadership came to an abrupt end with Mickey's hostile takeover complete and yet another unceremonious public firing.

From there, Murrey found himself in a prime position to take over AXW from Cross in early 2023, which paved the way for WWE's birth.

Why do I bring all of this up? Well, it's all relevant to what comes next. You see, Murrey has not been the biggest fan of WOW, nor of the industry website that the wrestling union produced.

He has regularly protested the very existence of WOW, and has been a constant thorn in the side of the WOW Administration with each WOW Week since he arrived.

Now, that isn't to say that he doesn't have legitimate gripes, but Murrey hasn't just complained about WOW. Rather, he has repeatedly threatened an alternative to WOW, and the response from the Administration was always "whatever that means" as they shrugged and looked the other way.

You may remember that my last entry into this article was my covering the controversy over the "Available Talent List". Well, who do you think kicked off WWE's aversion to that list? Yep, you guessed it...the man of the hour.

So, what do we think now that Murrey has actually announced the formation of this new supposed counter-confederation to the WOW wrestling promotional union? For now, the WOW Administration is reportedly watching intently, but patiently. As of right now, this just appears to be a new undertaking wherein Murrey is attempting to bolster the image and prestige of the brand that he now represents once again.

In the long run, though, is it factual to call WIN a threat to WOW? Honestly, I don't think so, but we will see what he does next here.

All I can advise the audience to do going forward is to keep an eye open on this particular developing story, because it just may evolve into something which commands a sequel installment in this segment of the magazine. Let us wait and see!
